

## **Best Practice-I**

## 1. Title of the practice: Heritage Walk

#### 2. Goals

- To visit the historically important places in Satara (Palace) city.
- To collect the information about the historically important places in Satara city.
- To make the students aware of the past glory of the Maratha Empire.
- To develop research aptitude among the students.

#### 3. The Context

Satara was the capital of Maratha Empire from 1708 under the rule of Chh. Shahu Maharaj. His Successors Chh. Raja Ram Maharaj and Chh. Pratapsinh Maharaj made this palace beautiful and glorious by building a number of archiheritical structures, which include palace, Golbagh (a garden), Water storage tanks, British Cementery, Prisons, Police Head Quarter, Hattikhana (stable for eleohants) etc. Some of these structures are on the rain and many are still intact.

The Department of History of our college in collboration with 'Jidhanyasa'-a Historical Research and Conservation Institute, Satara organized the Heritage Walk of these places for the students of our college.

#### 4. The Practice

- a) The Heritage Walk was organized for the students on 21st April, 2018.
- b) More than 125 students participated in this activity
- c) The Heritage Walk was inaugurated at the hands of Mayor of Satara City Mrs. Madhavi Kadam and Prin.Dr. Y.S. Patane
- d) Shri Vikrant Mandape, Shri Nilesh Pandit, Vijay Mandake. Of 'Jidhanyasa' institute, Mrs. Rajlaxmi Shivankar. Dy.S.P. of Satara City, Dr. R.B. Satpute and Prof. G.G. Katkar of our college worked as guides and gave the information about hoistorical importance of these places.
- e) The palace of Chh. Shahu Maharaj, Gollbagh (a historical garden), 'Hattikhana' (a stable for elephants), 'Panchpali Houd', 'Kamani Houd', 'Chattri Houd'-Water storage tanks, British Cemetery, Prison build by Chinese prisoners are some of the places visited by the students.
- f) All guides provided information about these historical structures to the participants.

#### 5. Evidence of Success

- a) The 'Heritage Walk' created awareness among students about historically important places in Satara as a palace.
- b) The students, teachers, researchers, scholars, inquisitors and common citizens participated in the 'Heritage Walk'.
- c) It provided information about all these places to the ruined age old structures came to light and their historical importance is underlined.
- d) The report on 'Heritage Walk' was published in news papers and media.
- e) The participants got knowledge of historically important places and Maratha Empire

#### 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- a) Some of the archiheritical structures are completely damaged and ruined. They are cumbersome, neglected and unpreserved.
- b) There is no information and reference of some of the historical structures in the city.
- c) The archaeological department of the state has not been paying attention to protect, repair and preserve these structures.

#### 7. Notes

The 'Heritage Walk' proved very helpful in providing information about age old historically important places in Satara city. It created awareness among the students, researchers and sinologists. It threw light upon the History of Maratha Empire.

## 9. Title of the practice: Best Student Reader Awards

#### 10.Goals

- To create interest for reading among the students.
- To inspire the students to enrich knowledge.
- To make college library more accessional to students.
- To make maximum use of college library.

#### 11. The Context

It is said that 'okpky rj okpky' [Reading helps to survive] which means knowledge is power. With the power of knowledge a person becomes not only wise but also sensible and cultured. Reading of books helps the students to develop and shape their personality.

- k) The accession record of books read by the students is maintained through soft-ware in the library.
- 1) In the month of February, the list of students who read maximum number of books is prepared and notified to the students.
- m) 50% students from open categories and 50% students from reserved categories are shortlisted.
- n) These selected students are called interview before the library committee.
- o) The interviews are entirely based on the books read by the respective students.
- p) Two students from open category and two students from reserved category are selected strictly on the basis of their performance in the interview and the books they have read.
- q) These students are felicitated with 'Best Student Reader Awards' at the annual prize distribution function of the college.
- r) These awardees are given 'certificates, case prizes and set of books and honoured.

#### 13. Evidence of Success.

Through this practice it is observed that the students have started to visit the library regularly. They are inclined to read books, journals, magazines own their own. It helps to develop their reading habits, increases their knowledge, enhance grasping capacity. The college library is used extensively for the benefit of students.

#### 14. Problems Encountered And Resources Required.

- d) As reading habit of students is on the decline the students are reluctant to participate in this activity, their response is marginal.
- e) Many a times the students don't get the books of their own interest in the college library.
- f) The prizes and cash amount of prizes need to be increased.

#### 15.Notes

It is seen that the objectives and goals are very good but the response of the students is not so good. The reading habit of students is on decline. It is necessary to take efforts to attract the students towards this activity.
